Novice Information sheet

Thank you for your interest in a Novice course!. Note this is *not* a learn to ride course, all participants must have the prerequisite abilities listed here.



The Novice course is an introduction to safe bike handling skills and using a bike for transportation through a residential area. Upon completion of this course, participants should be comfortable with some basic handling skills: children under age 14 may be comfortable riding on sidewalks while those 14 or older may be introduced to riding on very quiet residential roads.

This course is not intended to provide a complete education on cycling in residential areas: all participants should go on to attend an Intermediate course (when age and/or skill is appropriate).

Novice is broken into a series of parts: all parts must be attended to complete the course.

- Bike and helmet check
- Handling skills
- Bike security
- Community ride (if skills are appropriate)

Each participant must provide the following equipment for this course:

- a properly fitting bicycle, in good working condition; and
- a certified bicycle helmet, in good condition and with proper fit.

Bicvcle:

In order to participate in and get the most out of this course:

- a bike with gears is recommended;
- e-bikes are acceptable.

Each participant must be able to complete the list of skills shown <u>here</u> before attending this course.

Helmet:

Children are required by law to wear a helmet while bicycling: **children who do not have an appropriate helmet will not be allowed to participate in on-bike activities.** No refund or transfer will be available. More information on helmets can be found here.

- 1. The helmet **must be certified for bicycle use**, not a winter sports, or skating helmet.
- 2. Helmet should be less than 5 years old, and have never had an impact with something hard (including falling off a shelf or being dropped onto concrete). If in doubt, get a new helmet. Please do not trust a rental helmet, or one borrowed from someone else because you don't know what it's been through.
 - 3. It should fit the head properly. See the above link for a video on helmet fit.

Religious headwear & helmet use:

Most religious headwear can be accommodated under a regular bike helmet. See the above link for more information on religious headwear & bike helmets.

We evaluate every participant's cycling ability and may not allow participants to join the community ride if skills are inadequate. The community ride is a very basic introduction to using a bike for transportation: children under age 14 will learn how to ride on the sidewalk and may briefly ride on Grade 1 or Grade 2 roads. Those 14 or older may be introduced to riding on Grade 1 or Grade 2 roads. More information on road grades can be downloaded here/br/

This course may be a fair-weather course or may run rain-or-shine. If the course is expected to run no matter the weather, participants should dress appropriately for changing weather.
